Steve Harvey Morning Show
Mistress of Ceremony



Shirley Strawberry is coming off one of her most rewarded years in her prestigious career as radio co-host. Her book "The Strawberry Letter" won the NAACP Image Award for best debut Author of a Non-fiction Book. She was also voted One of the Most Influential Women in Radio by Radio Ink Magazine. A couple accolades that she is dearly blessed and thankful for.

I'm a native Chicagoan. I was born on July 28, many...many years ago (smiles) in the town with the golden coast. My father died when I was just a year old, and tragically, his death was the catalyst that changed my life forever. Soon, our family went from living comfortably to barely making ends meet.

Growing up, I was a great student but always got into trouble for talking too much! I just would not — could not — be quiet! It was the same at home. I always had something to say and I definitely had a smart mouth.

I also had an affinity for music. I couldn't sing all that well, but it was my love of music that started my love affair with radio. Often, I would practice speaking like the women I heard on the radio. At that time, becoming a national radio personality was a dream that I hadn't considered could be a reality.

When I decided to pursue a career in radio, my family thought I was crazy. But I did it anyway. My career in radio started as a radio jock in the mid-80s at Chicago's WCGI-FM, where I was the co-host of the Doug Banks Show. By the early 90s, my local popularity had soared enough to pique the interest of the Hollywood radio scene, where I began working at 92.3 The Beat, KKBT-FM. In Los Angeles, I quickly built a loyal fan base. In 2000, the radio mogul, Cathy Hughes, and her Radio One behemoth, took over that station. I was offered the job of Steve Harvey's co-host. That was big for me!

Today, and I say this with a great deal of humility, I have worked to become one of the most recognizable names and voices in radio today. Steve Harvey dubbed me "The Best Voice in Radio"! I never imagined that one day I'd be sitting in the co-pilot seat of one of today's largest, nationally syndicated radio morning shows in the country - with nearly eight million listeners. For more than a decade, I've sat side by side with Steve, while I've had the pleasure of watching the country fall in love - with my voice - and wisdom, during the show's Strawberry Letter segment. God is truly good!

Every day, during this segment, Steve and I offer honest advice to listeners who have sent in letters about the woes in their lives. The segment has grown to be so successful that I was asked to write a book based on the letters from the show. The result, *The Strawberry Letter - Real Talk. Real Advice, Because Bitterness Isn't Sexy*. I couldn't ask for a better life. I am a happily single mother, career woman and lifestyle liaison to all of my close friends.

2012 Woman of the Year

Rev. Portia Wills Lee, M.Div.

Rev. Portia Wills Lee, M.Div., is serving in her 16th year as the Senior Pastor and Founder of Trinity Tabernacle Baptist Church located in the prominent Atlanta Suburb of Mableton, located in Cobb County, Georgia. Pastor Lee is a contemporary woman of God shaped in the image and the witness of Queen Esther, a change agent for Christ, and is anointed with unique inspirational gift in preaching and teaching. As a compassionate pastor, Rev. Wills-Lee is a woman of God blessed with the gift and anointing to heal the broken in heart, the broken in spirit and the broken in body.

A strong academician, Rev. Portia Wills-Lee is a graduate of Middle Tennessee State University in Murfreesboro, TN where she earned a Bachelor of Arts degree. She matriculated from the Interdenominational Theological Center of Atlanta, GA with a Masters of Divinity and is currently pursuing a Doctorate of Ministry degree from Colombia Theological Seminary in Decatur, GA. Pastor Lee continues to serve as an adjunct professor at the Interdenominational Theological Center. Since May of 2012, she has served as the Interim Dean of the Selma T. And Harry V. Richardson Fellowship (non-denominational) of the Interdenominational Theological Center and has mentored countless men and women in the ministry.

Understanding God's call for the church to provide restoration and renewal, this powerful vessel set out and firmly planted this evangelical mission and family centered congregation in an area rich for harvesting new believers and ripe for renewing those who have walked away from faith. Pastor Lee, through the junction of the Holy Spirit, aligned Trinity Tabernacle Baptist Church with the American Baptist Churches, USA.

A counselor, missionary, and community leader, Pastor Lee maintains the posture and presence to be a conduit through which her congregants and the community have access to God's power, truth, love and Word. An international evangelist and speaker, Pastor Lee serves as an international delegate to West Africa, Guyana, South America and the West Indies. As an author she has contributed to such publications as *Those Preaching Women*, *The African American Pulpit*, *The African American Preaching Library* and *Blow The Trumpet In Zion*. She is currently finalizing her first manuscript to be published in 2012.

A major community leader, Pastor Lee played a critical role in establishing the Mableton Community Empowerment Center (MCEC), a 501(c)(3) organization focused on education and minority business development. As a history maker, in January 2012 Pastor Portia Wills Lee was inducted as the first woman to serve as the Vice President of Administration for the Concerned Black Clergy of Metropolitan Atlanta. For the third time she has been recognized in the 100 Most Influential Pastors of Atlanta by the Atlanta Business Chronicle. Pastor Lee is the 2012 recipient of the Gardner C. Taylor award for prophetic leadership from the Interdenominational Theological Center and also the 2012 recipient of the Woman of the Year Award from Atlanta's Women of Distinction.

Finally, Pastor Lee's greatest joy comes from being a mother to her 21 year old daughter and best friend Nina Yvette Lee. Through her life she has attested that she believes that God's favor is more precious than life itself. As such, she continues to give her whole heart, mind, and body to God as an expression of her devotion and gratitude.


